All non-nursing courses must be passed with a minimum grade of C and all nursing courses must be passed with a grade of C+ to continue in the program. A minimum GPA of 2.0 must be attained at the end of each semester to remain in the program and for graduation. A student successfully completing PN1 may be eligible to take the test for Certification as a Nurse Aid (CNA).

Students successfully completing PN 1 may be eligible for a Certificate as a Nurse Aide (CNA).
