NOTES:

All English courses have prerequisites.

Composition & Literature 1 & 2 are prerequisites for all other English courses (except Creative Writing, Reading and Writing Poetry for which Composition and Literature I is the prerequisite).

All Communications courses receive English credit, **except** broadcasting production courses (i.e. Radio Production, TV Production 1 & 2, and all internships and newspaper production courses).

- **Social Science** courses include History (HIS), Political Science (POLSC), Economics (ECON) and Geography (GEOG).
- **Behavioral Science** courses include Sociology (SOC), Psychology (PSYCH), Anthropology (ANTHR) and Geography (GEOG). General Psychology is the prerequisite for all upper level psychology courses.
- **Humanities** courses include Art (ART), Dance (DANCE), Music (MUSIC), Foreign Language (ARABC, CHINS, FREN, GER, ITAL, SPAN), Literature (ENG), Film (FILM), Philosophy (PHIL), Theater (THEAT) and Photography at ARTWS.

² Students may take no more than 6 literature credits to satisfy the Humanities requirement.

³ A minimum of one foreign language course, at any level, is required for any student who enrolled in this curriculum after September 1, 2007.
