 - Anatomy and Physiology II² 4 credits
- Students must submit completed physical exams, drug screen and background check prior to taking a clinical Nursing course.
- Criminal background checks must be completed prior to entrance into the nursing program. Students whose
 drug screens and background checks are deemed unsatisfactory may be denied access into the Nursing program.
 Failure to qualify for and meet clinical requirements may prevent completion of the program. Withdrawal from
 the program may be necessary if students cannot be placed for clinical experiences.

Tutoring is available for basic skills required for the entrance exam in the Academic Support Center.

All non-nursing courses must be passed with a minimum grade of C and all nursing courses must be passed with a grade of C+ to continue in the program. A minimum GPA of 2.0 must be attained at the end of each semester to remain in the program and for graduation. A student successfully completing PN1 may be eligible to take the test for Certification as a Nurse Aid (CNA).

Students successfully completing PN 1 may be eligible for a Certificate as a Nurse Aide (CNA).

Course sequence is dependent upon prerequisites. Students who fail a nursing course or who withdraw from the program will be given consideration for one more opportunity to complete the program. See catalog for more information.
