Students enrolled in the Dietetic Technician Program must earn a "C" in all required Core Nutrition and Clinical Practicum courses in order to continue in the program. They must also maintain a minimum GPA of 2.0. to remain in the program. A grade of "C" in ALL COURSES is strongly recommended.

Fall only: NUTR 120: Foods and Foods Lab, NUTR 205: Clinical Nutrition, NUTR 245: Clinical Practicum 2

Spring only: NUTR 115: Nutrition Care 2, NUTR 145: Clinical Practicum 1, NUTR 118: Principles of Teaching Health Care, NUTR 107: Dietetic Seminar-Nutrition, NUTR 123: Food Service Systems Management, NUTR 247: Clinical Practicum 3

- **Choose ONLY those courses whose descriptions are labeled as "humanities credits" from:** ART, DANCE, ENG, MUSIC, FILM, THEAT, ARABC, CHINS, FREN, GER, ITAL, JAPNS, RUSSN, SPAN, PHIL.
- **Social Science** courses include History (HIS), Political Science (POLSC), Economics (ECON) and Geography (GEOG).

¹ NUTR 105: Nutrition Care I - Must be ready to take college level mathematics and ENG 101: Composition & Literature 1.

² NUTR 105: Nutrition Care I is prerequisite for NUTR 115: Nutrition Care 2. NUTR 115: Nutrition Care 2 and NUTR 118: Clinical Practicum 1 are co-requisites. If only one course can be taken it must be NUTR 115: Nutrition Care 2.

³ Contemporary Mathematics is acceptable.

⁴ NUTR 105/115: Nutrition Care 1 & 2, BIOL 121/123: Anatomy & Physiology 1&2 are prerequisite for NUTR 205: Clinical Nutrition. NUTR 205: Clinical Nutrition and NUTR 245: Clinical Practicum 2 are co-requisites. If only one course can be taken it must be Clinical Nutrition.

⁵ NUTR 205: Clinical Practicum 1 is prerequisite for NUTR 245: Clinical Practicum 2.

⁶ NUTR 245: Clinical Practicum 2 is prerequisite for NUTR 247: Clinical Practicum 3. NUTR 123: Food Service Systems Management and NUTR 247: Clinical Practicum 3 are co-requisites. If only one course can be taken it must be NUTR 123: Food Service Systems Management.

⁷ FOODS 120: Foods and Lab is prerequisite for NUTR 123: Food Service Systems Management.
