Students with less than one year of experience as an EMT must seek permission of the Curriculum Chair.

Poor mathematics scores will not exclude a student, but instead indicate the need for a remedial course prior to or concurrent with Paramedic 1 & 2. Students at the MATH 93-Beginning Algebra level should anticipate success.

Approximately 700 hours of clinical training is conducted in addition to the classroom sessions.

Schedule EMT courses first. Schedule CORE courses around them.

- Social Science courses include History (HIS), Political Science (POLSC), Economics (ECON) and Geography (GEOG).
- Behavioral Science courses include Sociology (SOC), Psychology (PSYCH), Anthropology (ANTHR) and Geography (GEOG). General Psychology is the
 prerequisite for all upper level psychology courses.
- Choose ONLY those courses whose descriptions are labeled as "humanities credits" from: ART, COMM, DANCE, ENG, MUSIC, FILM, THEAT, ARABC, CHINS, FREN, GER, ITAL, JAPNS, RUSSN, SPAN, PHIL.
