PLUS

To gain entrance into the nursing program, prior to enrollment or concurrently with the spring semester before taking the TEAS exam, students must complete the following courses with a C or better (2.0 on a 4.0 scale)

- **BIOL 121 Anatomy and Physiology I¹ – 4 credits**
- **BIOL 123 Anatomy and Physiology II¹ – 4 credits**
- **PSYCH 101 General Psychology – 3 credits**
- **ENG 101 Writing and Research – 3 credits**

- ❖ Students must submit completed physical exams, drug screen and background check prior to taking a clinical Nursing course.
- ❖ Criminal background checks must be completed prior to entrance into the nursing program. Students whose drug screens and background checks are deemed unsatisfactory may be denied access into the Nursing program. Failure to qualify for and meet clinical requirements may prevent completion of the program. Withdrawal from the program may be necessary if students cannot be placed for clinical experiences.
- ❖ Students must be certified from a Health Care Provider with a CPR course prior to beginning the program.

- ***All non-nursing courses must be passed with a minimum grade of “C” and all nursing courses must be passed with a minimum grade of C+ to continue in the program.*** A minimum GPA of 2.0 must be attained at the end of each semester to remain in the program and for graduation. Students who fail a nursing course or who withdraw from the program will be given consideration for one more opportunity to complete the program. If the student returns to the program after more than one year of absence, he/she must take a challenge exam from the previous nursing courses in order to evaluate competency in that area.
- **The Advance Standing policy for LPN to RN may be obtained from the Nursing Department.** A PN graduate from Westchester Community College’s LPN program who obtained a grade point average of B or better in the entire PN program can receive 8 challenge credits for A.D.N. I. An LPN from another program must apply to take and successfully complete the challenge exam in order to receive the 8 challenge credits.
