They may transfer as free electives. Therefore, MATH 135-College Algebra with Trigonometry and MATH 140-Statistics (or higher) are recommended. MATH 130 and MATH 135 CAN NOT BE USED TO FULFILL BOTH MATH REQUIREMENTS.
