Experience.

Offered only in the spring semester. Addiction Group Counseling in the late afternoon & Counseling Models in the evening. The three clinical courses no longer have to be taken in any particular order (HSERV 183, 280 and 282) Advisors should have students take AT LEAST ONE CDC COURSE each semester. The Clinical Courses and associated internships (HSERV 183/184; 280/281; 282/283 require permission of the Curriculum Chairperson for registration.
